Harvest Your Fruit Trees & Help Save Local Bears & the Chili Cookoff is Back This Year! Our 8th Annual Apple Cider Festival: Saturday, October 11th, 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. Live music and a homemade chili lunch, including drinks and all the fixings, for just \$5 from 11:30 till the food is gone.

Bring your harvested apples or any stone-free fruit to the Community Center and with a little work enjoy fresh homemade cider! It is a really fun work party for all ages. Everybody is invited to roll up their sleeves to help process the community's apple harvest. Washing, chopping, pressing, and serving the cider takes many hands. The goal is to keep the fruit away from prowling bears. This helps keep the wildlife from getting into trouble, and in the process we get to enjoy your company and some fresh cider too.

If you don't have fruit trees, no problem. Just bring your store-bought apples to add to the harvest fruit for free cider pressing. Bring your own quart size cider containers to pack your apple goodness home. If you bring some fruit, you can take home a quart size container of cider. So many changes in life these days!! Isn't it comforting that the Nine Mile Community Center has looked about the same for the last 110 years?

Fortunately, nowadays we have indoor plumbing. It was not always that way. Our community center water well record dates back to 1974 and as near we can tell that is when the first indoor restrooms were installed in Stark School. Before that, since 1915, the boys and girls outhouses were the only way to go for polite company. Although the outdoor privies have been closed for some time they are still a



quintessential part of the historic school grounds, a National Historic Register landmark.

If you have seen our old outhouses lately they look pretty neglected. Tilting on wood bases that are rotting like one of them could fall over with a puff of wind. Their little roofs are way past due for replacement and much of the wood trim needs repair. They could use a lot of hands on restoration work.

Historic preservation is part of what we do at the community center, but we're afraid the historic outhouses have been low on our project priority list. That is changing because without prompt action they will literally fall apart and be lost to history. Our Board has been discussing options for some time, and in September we committed to a new 2026 project to preserve and protect our vintage privies.

This fall we will apply for historic preservation grant assistance. We are also reaching out to you as our neighbors who would like to help preserve a part of local history at the Stark School. Please support the Stark School outhouses restoration project. We need local matching funds for any grant we receive.

Please vote X for the candidates listed below. The election is open to all bona fide residents, 18 or older, of the 59846 Zip Code area.

There are three ways to vote. All ballots must be in our P.O. Box by October 14th, or at the Community Center by 7:00 p.m. Election Day—Tuesday, October 14th.

- By Mail: On a separate piece of paper or on your envelope we need 3 things: your printed name; your signature; and your address. We require all of this information for your ballot to be counted.
- **Drop-Off Box:** At the Community Center. The drop box will be available during the Spaghetti Social, Apple Cider Festival, and before 7:00 p.m. Tuesday, October 14th. Current Board members will monitor the box. If you utilize this method, we still need on a separate piece of paper or envelope: **your printed name; signature; and address**.
- In Person: You can also vote in person from 6:30 to 7:00 p.m. Tuesday, October 14th at the Community Center.

If there are two or more eligible voters in your household you can copy this ballot sheet, or simply write out the ballot portion of this page and vote on it. We will still need the printed name of each additional voter, as well as their signature and address to verify that individual as a bona fide resident of the 59846 Zip Code area.
